Just a thought -- Perhaps the "Adamic tongue" is not a language that is taught, but only a language that is understood – meaning that the interaction with the Lord is pure between you and He and that that is the language that we refer to as the Adamic tongue. – OC Zephaniah 2:11 - "For then will I turn to the people a pure language, that they may all call upon the name of the Lord, to serve him with one consent." The pure language is perhaps to understand who we worship and how to worship Him. Joseph Smith spoke English but probably understood the Adamic tongue which quite possibly is to know who to worship, how to worship, how to call upon His name, and how to interact with Him personally. In terms of the arrangement of words and phrases to create well-formed sentences in language – syntax – it requires only yours, not Gods. There is no set of rules for or an analysis of the words you use, just you and God. That is the Adamic tongue – perhaps? Are we not finding that as we gain light and truth, we are learning a new language, and that the confounding of our language (MCKABY Platt paper), in terms of understanding God, is dissipating? What Denver is teaching is the pure language. – Yes?
